## Advocations – May 2014



Dear Friends,

The Church of the Holy Spirit's Vestry spent the day on March 22nd at Holderness School, in a retreat led by Hannah Anderson, the Canon to the Ordinary (Bishop Rob's assistant).

The retreat tackled head-on some of the difficult challenges facing the church as we seek to become an intergenerational, barrier-free, 21st-century congregation, and to incarnate this vision in a new building that will support rather than hinder our mission.

Canon Hannah called on us to consider the Parable of the Sower (Matthew 13:1-9): That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the lake. Such great crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat there, while the whole crowd stood on the beach. And he told them many things in parables, saying: "Listen! A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seeds fell on the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and they sprang up quickly, since they had no depth of soil. But when the sun rose, they were scorched; and since they had no root, they withered away. Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Let anyone with ears listen!"

We discussed the quality of the "soil" at CHS, how we are seeking to "transplant the garden" to a new location, and how we can cultivate that garden over the next couple of years. Our ideas focused around a clearer articulation of the parish's mission; fellowship and inreach to existing members; and ways to welcome and include children and families.

It was also clear that we must focus on growth and new members, even before we have the attractive new sanctuary to which to welcome them, and that conclusion became central to Grace's "Living Water" sermon on March 23rd.

The Vestry also drafted the following "Covenant of Values" for our life together:

### SHARED VALUES THAT GUIDE US

- Willingness to talk about a personal relationship with God.
- Openness to trying new ways of doing things.
- Caring for people in and beyond the parish.
- Coming together to worship God on a weekly basis.
- Participation is valued in the life of the parish.
- Respect for the diverse ways people express faith.
- Open and welcoming to all people.
- Welcoming of different ideas.
- We follow the tradition of Jesus Christ who accepted all types of people.

## Exciting progress on the building project!

The Capital Campaign Committee is pleased to report that the campaign tally currently stands at 77% (\$308,000) in our progress toward our goal of raising \$400,000 to build the new church. If they have not yet contacted you, they will probably do so soon, as we work on getting all the way to 100%! Our profoundest thanks to those whose pledges have gotten us this far toward our vision of a barrier-free, flexible, efficient building that will position us to expand our worship, fellowship, formation and outreach ministries.


Meanwhile, a very exciting opportunity has arisen for us to pursue a significant state grant that would allow us to incorporate a commercial kitchen and community gathering space (parish hall) into the project from the start. This extension of the building would allow us to fill a clear need in the community, which lacks both commercial kitchens and affordable gathering spaces. We are working closely with Whole Village, the Farmers' Market, and many other local groups who are enthusiastic about the possibility of this vision coming to fruition. The grant application is a daunting one, and of course nothing is guaranteed; but we are working hard to make our case as well as we can. I am very excited about this chance to live more fully into our mission of serving the community in Plymouth and the surrounding area.

Please continue to keep the Capital Campaign and the grant application process in your prayers!

## In Search of Fundraising Ideas

The budget we adopted for 2014 includes \$3,000 in fundraising income. We will likely participate in the town-wide yard sale in September and that has generally brought in about \$1,000. But that means we will still need to come with a fundraiser (or two?) which will hopefully bring in the other \$2,000. One event we have held in the past was the auction of goods and services donated by members of the church. That event wasn't held last year so perhaps someone(s) would like to step forward and get it going for this year – perhaps late May or sometime in June? Or maybe you have a brilliant idea for a fundraiser which we haven't tried before. If you do, please talk to any member of the Vestry or Grace. With the right idea, there will likely be people who will step up to assist in carrying it out – just give us a shout. It is really important that we don't put off keeping our budget in balance.


## Advocations (con't from page 1)
